Mexico lies between the USA and South America, in a region known as Central America. It's a long strip of land with coast on both sides; the Pacific Ocean on the west, and the Gulf of Mexico and Caribbean Sea in the east.

Much of Mexico is covered by mountains, and the highest peaks are over 5,000 metres. The north of the country is dominated by deserts, and these regions receive so little rain that only a few specially adapted plants and animals can survive. In the centre lies its sprawling capital Mexico City. The south of Mexico is close to the equator so it has a tropical climate, and covered by vast rainforests with a huge diversity of plants and animals.
