Spelling Mix Ups ???

there - is an adverb meaning 'that location'.
The exit is over **there**.

their - is a pronoun used to show possession.
What colour is **their** car?

they're - is a contraction of 'they are'.
They're reading a book.

These words are homophones - this means they are pronounced the same but have different meanings.

Spelling Mix Ups ???

where - is an adverb relating to place/position.
I know **where** you left it.

were - is the plural past tense of the verb 'are'.
We **were** playing outside?

we're - is a contraction of 'we are'.
We're going to the park.

wear - is used when talking about clothing.
I don't know what to **wear**.

Don't let these words confuse you - they might sound similar but they have different meanings.

Past Simple - Regular verbs areal

Spelling rules

Infinitive + ed/d	visit - visit ed love - love d
Vowel + y: ed	enjoy - enjoy ed
Consonant + y: ied	study - stud ied
One-syllable verb 1 vowel + 1 consonant: Double consonant + ed	stop - stop ped bat - bat ted
Two-syllable with stress on second syllable and ending with a single consonant: Double consonant + ed	permit - permit ted commit - commit ted
